Residential Safety

Through Brampton's **Neighbourhood Watch Program**, citizens are kept informed about crimes, learn how to protect their homes and families, and work with Peel Police to tackle crime problems in their neighbourhoods.

Safety Skills Workshops are presented at locations throughout the city to teach residents about home security, personal safety, auto theft, fraud and other crime prevention topics.

The **Crime Alert Program** provides citizens with current information about criminal activity impacting the city. The goal is to make people aware of crime concerns, and to encourage them to assist police by reporting suspicious incidents. Crime alerts can be found at www.bramptonsafecity.ca

Child and Youth Safety

Safe City organizes safety presentations for children and young adults, as well as educational workshops for parents and caregivers on how to keep children safe from crime and injury.

The **Youth Education and Safety Program (YES)** engages student volunteers (14 to 18 years of age) in community safety projects. Young people participating in the program receive training and leadership development opportunities.

Road Safety

The **Road Watch Program** gives residents and visitors an opportunity to keep our roads safe by reporting dangerous and aggressive drivers to police. Brampton's **Road Safety Committee** works with citizens to find effective ways to address traffic safety issues.

Local Heros

The Local Heroes Awards are presented each year to recognize people in Brampton who are making extraordinary contributions to keep our citizens safe from crime and injury. Let us hear your story.

Workplace Safety

Safe City supports Brampton's business community by providing programs and services to business firms to enhance safety in the workplace.

Business owners are supported with resources and information to reduce the risk of theft, fraud, vandalism and other business-related crimes.

The Association also provides training to help businesses maintain a safe and healthy work environment for their employees.
